For cities, educational institutions, and any other entity that does not sell natives or provide land care services, they must actively promote native plants to qualify for ONPN professional membership.

I understand the right to use the ONPN logo is personal to members and may not be assigned or transferred to any other entity without prior written consent of the ONPN Program.
